## **State Street Announces Winners of the 2018 Institutional Press Awards, Asia Pacific**

**BEIJING, HONG KONG, SHANGHAI, SINGAPORE, SYDNEY, TAIWAN, 28 November 2018** — State Street Corporation (NYSE: STT) announced today the winners of the seventh annual State Street Institutional Press Awards, Asia Pacific, which recognizes outstanding institutional financial news reporting across the region.

A record number of submissions were received this year, with more than 200 entries from publications across Asia Pacific including Hong Kong, Mainland China, Singapore, Australia, Taiwan and Philippine. This year, an Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) category was introduced to commend the media's reporting and analysis of the rise of ESG investing.

All winners were chosen by an independent panel of six industry professionals led by William Mellor, former senior writer and Asia correspondent with Bloomberg News, and currently independent writer, producer and consultant. The panel of judges also included:

- Professor Anthony Fung, director, School of Journalism and Communication, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, who was also the lead judge for the Chinese categories
- Andrew Main, veteran business journalist, emcee and commentator
- Nick Pollard, managing director, Asia Pacific, The CFA Institute
- Sally Wong, CEO, Hong Kong Investment Funds Association
- Wu Chen, editorial director, The Economist Global Business Review

The outstanding contribution to institutional journalism recognition was awarded to Alison Tudor-Ackroyd, Managing Editor of Haymarket Financial Media, which publishes FinanceAsia, AsianInvestor and CorporateTreasurer. The judges were impressed with her breadth of experience in, and deep understanding of institutional journalism, her quality of writing, commitment to accurate reporting and the development of fledgling reporters in Asia Pacific. Alison has over 20 years reporting on institutional investment stories in Hong Kong, Tokyo, London, Milan and Paris for the likes of Reuters and Wall Street Journal in addition to Haymarket.

“We congratulate all of the winners and highly commended journalists for their high quality and professional work,” said Wai-Kwong Seck, State Street’s Chief Executive Officer, APAC. “We are pleased to host this special event for the seventh year. It recognizes journalism’s significant contribution in bridging the gap between the investment community and the public to foster a deeper understanding of the latest developments in the financial world in this region.”

“It has been both a challenging and stimulating task for the panel of judges to choose and honour the winners from an outstanding field of entries,” said William Mellor, the lead judge for the press awards. “It is particularly rewarding to see that the enthusiasm for and participation in the Press Awards continues to grow each year.
